

JROTC Masters Program @ Excelsior College:

With supporting education credits from the University of Colorado (UCCS), Excelsior College offers JROTC instructors, with a Baccalaureate Degree, the opportunity to earn a Master of Arts Degree in Liberal Studies, with the focus on Educational Leadership. Candidates first earn 15 graduate credits from UCCS based upon JROTC attended seminar and distance learning efforts. Then, they transfer these fifteen credits to Excelsior College, completing four three-credit on-line courses and a six-credit Masters Thesis. Degree candidates take the following courses with UCCS based upon their attendance at the JROTC new instructor or re-certification training, and completing the on-line JROTC Distance Learning Courses. To receive accreditation from UCCS, students will write one paper (topic provided by UCCS Instructor of Record) per course.

UCCS Courses: applicants take their choice of five of these three-credit courses (take one at a time, or as many as three per semester. Your choice!): **TED 500, TED 501, TED 552, TED 571, CURR 5598, LEAD 515, LEAD 553, or LEAD 598.**

Cost per credit ranges from \$65 for LEAD 553 and Lead 598, to \$130 per credit for the other courses cited. **Total Cost** approximately **\$1,260.00 to as much as \$1,990** (no fees). *Questions: Call Bob Greene: (303)840-3063 or (720)837-7926.*

Upon completion of these five courses the applicant will then transfer to Excelsior College and continue their Masters program with Excelsior's Liberal Studies Department. Point of contact there is:
